Last Saturday (January 5), I asked John Weiss and Al Bally (both of whom just happened to be hanging around following the C-172 migration) if they wanted to go play in the sky. They did, so after a few moments of contemplation, we decided to fly down to Bult Field (C56) to check out the Bult Mansion. Neither John nor Al were aware of the mansion's existence, and while I had seen it many times while refueling N8ML, I had never ventured in to check out the secrets it held. We had no idea that we were in for a great surprise!

The flight to Bult was rather fast (said no Cherokee driver, ever), thanks to a 35-knot tailwind. We landed, parked, and walked over to the mansion where we encountered the only glitch in the mission - the front door. Despite multiple attempts to push the door open, each with an increased level of effort, it simply would not budge. We checked the time - 3:30 PM - and agreed we were attempting to enter during the published 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM operating hours. Frustrated, but undeterred, we discussed and evaluated the situation. It quickly became clear that we only had one option left: pull the door instead. So we pulled. It opened. We were in! We had barely made our way through the door when we saw a sign that read "GHQ Military Museum" with an arrow pointing down a hallway. No further discussion was needed. We all knew where we needed to go.

Tucked away at the far end of the publicly-accessible portion of the Bult Mansion, we found a small room about the size of a one-car garage. As we stepped into the room, we were instantly swept back to the 1940s by the impressive "Life at 50 Below" display of U.S. Army Air Corps uniforms and life support gear. We then wandered around the room several times as we took in and considered the tools, magazines, official correspondence, and a detailed set of story boards with photographs depicting life in a German POW camp from the authentic and highly personal perspective of downed B-17 pilot Bernard Kerouac, a Kankakee native. To say "it was awesome" would be a gross understatement. I simply do not have the words to do it justice, so I will just stop now while I am way behind.

In all, we spent about forty-five minutes soaking in as many of the details as we were able. I am certain we missed quite a few, and I know a return trip is most definitely necessary. (What's that? I need to fly again? Oh darn!)

Our challenge is to offer all young and old the opportunity to view experience and learn about our Nation's military services during peace time, war, or conflict around the world. We want all of America to understand, appreciate, and respect all that have served our country and protected our freedom. This is the purpose of our museum."

In my humble opinion, whether you drive or fly to see it, the GHQ Military Museum is worth the effort. The museum is located at Bult Field 28261 S. Kedzie Ave., Monee, Ilinois 60449.
